The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo Association is a non-profit organization that strives to provide an outlet for the youth of Texas to participate in the agricultural industry. SASSRA is committed to the humane treatment of every animal exhibited and takes every possible precaution to insure the safety and well-being of participating animals and exhibitors.

The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo Association, its officials, directors, employees and agents from hereinafter referred to as **Show Management**.

### Statement of Liability

All exhibits are under the control and direction of the Show Management, but the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo is not responsible to any loss or damage that may occur even as a result of our own negligence. The exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and for its description as given in the catalog. He or she shall indemnify the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as any damage or injury to any other person or property, cause by the exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited with such exhibition or any of the animals exhibited, even if caused by the negligence of the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo. Exhibitor and each signatory hereto, and any servant, agent, family member or employee of the Exhibitor hereby waives all right to sue the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo, even as a result of the Stock Show's negligence.

**1. Interpretation and Violation of Rules:** Individuals, including participants, are requested to report any rule violation(s) to the Show Management immediately so that appropriate action may be taken. The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo Association Executive Committee reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and settle and determine all matters, questions and amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. Any exhibitor who violates any of these rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and may be subject to such penalty as the Executive Committee may order.

**2. Eligibility:** Competition is open to the world, with the exception of the Junior Show (see Junior Show Rules) and age regulations on Youth Shows. This is an invitational Livestock Show; SASSRA reserves the right to extend or withhold an invitation to any exhibitor.

### 3. Ineligible Entries:

**a. Disqualified Exhibitors:** The Show, cooperating with the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association and using the Rule Infraction Database, reserves the right to refuse entry of any exhibitor. An exhibitor found in violation of any Show rules is subject to have his/her name and the result of the rule violation submitted to the Rule Infraction Database administered by the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association.

**b. Diseased Animals:** Diseased animals cannot enter the Livestock Show area or grounds. Superintendents will refuse unloading privileges to animals showing signs and symptoms of disease.

**c. Barren Animals:** Barren animals are not eligible for breeding classes.

**4. Social Security Number Requirement:** Every exhibitor and contestant must have a Social Security Number to be eligible to participate in the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo. **Social Security Numbers must be recorded on entry forms.**

### 5. Entry Procedure:

**a. Entry Submission:** **ALL** entries are required to be submitted on current, official entry forms available at <http://www.sanangelorodeo.com>. Photocopies are acceptable though original signatures are required on all entries. Mail entry forms and payment to:

Application for entry in a junior livestock show must be made through an online entry procedure located at [www.sanangelorodeo.com](http://www.sanangelorodeo.com).

**b. Entering both Open and Junior Shows:** Exhibitors are allowed to enter both the Junior Show and Open Show when applicable, however, separate entry forms and fees are required.

**c. Acceptance of Entry:** The right is reserved to Show Management to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry and to refuse any accepted entry admittance to the fairgrounds. Entry does not guarantee space in the exhibition buildings. All fees will be forfeited.

**d. Completion of Entry:** Entry forms must be completed in its entirety. If any blank is left unfilled, the entry may not be accepted and will be returned to the exhibitor.

**6. Entry Deadline:** All Junior Show entries, including judging contests and agricultural mechanics must be electronically submitted by December 1, 2011, as well as the original entry forms and fees postmarked by **December 1, 2011**. All Open Show and Youth Show entry forms and fees must be postmarked by **January 15, 2012**.

**7. Late Entry:** Late Junior Show entries will be accepted postmarked December 2- December 15, 2011 for double entry fee. Junior Show entries will be accepted from December 16, 2011 until the end of check in for the show the entry is made and will automatically be charged a \$200 late fee per entry in addition to the entry fee. Show Management reserves the right to accept or deny any late entry. Late entries must still meet any and all ownership requirements.

Late Open Show & Youth entries will be accepted postmarked January 16, 2012 until the end of check in for the show for double entry fee. Show Management reserves the right to accept or deny any late entry. Late entries must still meet any and all ownership requirements.

**8. Entry Fees:** No entry will be accepted if payment for entry fees do not accompany entry forms. If the check accompanying the entries should be returned by the bank for any reason, the entry will be cancelled and returned. There will be a \$25 service charge on all returned checks. The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo has the right to ban any exhibitor from future participation should there be a continuous problem with fees from an exhibitor.

**9. Drug Testing Fees:** A \$2.00 per entry drug testing fee may be applied to any show which animals will be drug tested. The income from this fee will help off-set the expenses of such tests. These fees will automatically be added to the entry fee of the show on the official San Angelo Stock Show Entry Form(s).

**10. Miscellaneous Fees:**

Junior Show Processing Fee, per club/chapter.....\$10

**11. Erroneous Entry:** At the discretion of Show Management, exhibits that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper classes prior to judging. Show Management will decide the disposition of

each case of erroneous entry upon its merits. If such classes have been judged they shall not be reopened. No animal shall be changed from one class to another after deadline date unless it is ineligible for the class it is entered.

**12. Passes (Wristbands):** Passes for open, youth and junior show exhibitors will be mailed prior to the show and will be wristbands. Open Show passes will be mailed to the owner. Junior passes will be mailed to the Supervisor that submitted entries.

**Gate Passes:** Each exhibitor will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Livestock Show and may purchase additional passes in advance or at the gate. CEA's and AST's who are supervising projects will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid the duration of the show.

**Gate Pass** (Valid for duration of Livestock Show) \$10.00

No additional passes will be complimentary but may be purchased from the Livestock Office for \$10.00.

**Car Passes:** Exhibitors and Supervisors will be eligible to purchase Car Passes good for the duration of the show. Car passes must be fully affixed to the windshield of the vehicle. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of Car Pass and loss of parking privileges. These passes allow access to parking lots at Gate 2, Gate 4, and Gate 6.

**Car Pass** (Valid for duration of Livestock Show) \$20.00

**13. Refunds:** There are absolutely no refunds of entry fees or passes.

**14. Checks:** Premium (prize money) and floor checks will be issued in March or April following the show. Premium Sale checks will be issued once payment has been received from buyers. **In the event checks are not cashed within 90 days, they will be considered stale and must be reissued. There will be a reissue charge of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) in addition to any stop payment or other bank charges.** This only applies within the same year the checks were written.

**15. Special Rules:** Special Rules are published in any department where necessary. If there is a conflict between the Special Rules and the General Rules, Show Management will govern the final ruling.

### COMPETITION

**16. Judges:**

**a. Selection of Judges:** Show Management is solely responsible for the selection of judges and determining judging systems. Judges will be familiar with all rules, regulations and procedures of the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo.

**b. Judges' Decision:** The judges' decisions are final. If fraud, misrepresentation, error or collusion is discovered after awards have been given, the show Management or appointed referee will make a decision regarding final placement. Such decisions may be appealed to the Executive Committee from whose decision there will be no appeal. Protests alleging that the judges overlooked exhibits will not be considered.

**c. Interference with Judges:** An exhibitor or his representative who interferes with or displays disrespect to a judge or the Show could forfeit any monies earned or be subject to other penalties assessed by the show.

**17. Sifting/Classifying Committees:** The San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo reserves the right to appoint sifting committees to determine the eligibility of animals by inspection prior to judging. Animals must have blankets removed and be ready for inspection when called upon by the committee. The sifting committee will eliminate any animal which, in its judgment, is not qualified to compete and may be required to leave the grounds. Decisions of the sifters and/or classifiers will be final and protests will not be considered. Interference with sifters and/or classifiers will not be tolerated.

**18. Official Protests:** All protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$100, which will be refunded if the protest is sustained. Such protests and fees must be submitted to the Livestock Office. Protests must clearly state the cause of complaint or appeal, giving good and sufficient reasons therefore, and

must be delivered to the Management immediately upon the occasion for such protest. Protests not officially filed within 12 hours of the alleged incident will not be considered. These cases are referred to the Executive Director, who will have full power to act, and from whose decision there can be no appeal. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation.

### **19. Breed Representation:**

**a. Sheep or Goats:** Should any breed represented in the open or junior breeding sheep or goat shows not have a minimum of four (4) breeders and sixteen (16) sheep or goats entered in their respective show at the time of entry deadline, their fees will be returned to the exhibitors and no show will be held. The show will be discontinued for the following year, unless the breed association pays the premium for the succeeding year.

**b. Cattle:** Should any breed represented in the Junior Heifer Show, Youth Longhorn Show, or Open Longhorn Show not have a minimum of five (5) breeders and a total of twenty (20) animals in their respective show at the time of entry deadline, their fees will be returned to the exhibitors and no show will be held this year only.

**20. Animal Substitution:** Substitutions will be allowed within the same breed and division as the original entry at the time of check-in. Substitutions will not be allowed once check-in is completed. Any animal substituted must meet any and all requirements for the show it is to be entered. There is no fee for substitution.

### **21. Show Ring Competition:**

**a. Entry Numbers:** Each entry will be assigned a number. In some divisions exhibitors will receive corresponding cards with numbers which must be displayed by exhibitors during judging.

**b. Requirement to Show:** Animals properly entered in a show class and passed on by the sifting committee as eligible for competition must be brought into the show ring for competition. Exhibitors who refuse, without Show approval, to lead their animals for parade or for competition in the show ring will forfeit any and all prizes previously won. Also, by refusing the exhibitor may be barred from further participation in the Show and may be required to remove their stock from Show ground immediately.

**c. Arena Promptness:** Judging will not be delayed for animals entering the arena late. An exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time is barred from competition in the class.

**d. Judging Contests:** If and when an exhibitor is called upon to furnish one or more animals for the students judging contest, he or she will cooperate with the Show. Refusing to allow an animal to be used in this manner, without Show approval, could result in the forfeit of any prizes or such other action as the Show deems necessary. Selection of animals will be made under the direction of the department superintendent.

**e. Disqualification:** if an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below may be moved up to fill the vacated position.

**22. Animal/Exhibitor Disqualification:** To support fair competition, to provide a level playing field and to protect the safety of food, the showing of unethically fitted livestock, livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered, and/or animals being administered unapproved drugs is strictly prohibited. Additionally, any animal that has been administered a drug that is not FDA approved for its species is subject to disqualification if that animal test positive for that drug upon arrival at the San Angelo Fairgrounds. All animals must remain free and clear of all drug and chemical residues while on show grounds.

**a. Unethical Fitting:** Unethical fitting is defined as any attempt to alter an animal's performance or alter the natural contour, confirmation, or appearance of the animal's body, hide, hair, or feet by any unnatural means.

Examples of unethical fitting include, but are not limited to:

- Treating or massaging any part of the animal's body, internally or externally, with an irritant, counterirritant, or other substance to temporarily improve conformation.
- Surgical alterations, excluding the removal of warts or horns
- Use of Injections
- Striking the animal to cause swelling in a depressed area.
- Use of electrical contrivances

- Feeding of material not conducive to the health of the animal, safety of food or marketability of its carcass
- Blocking of nerves to prevent limping or switching of the tail
- The use of diuretics.
- The use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages in the feed or administered as a drench

**b. Over Age Animals:** Any animal over the age requirement set forth by rules specific to that division will be disqualified.

**c. Unapproved Drug Use:** The showing of any animal that has been administered during its life any quantity of any unapproved drug, chemical or medication is strictly prohibited. Such drugs include, but are not limited to, any diuretic, any unapproved growth stimulant or other unapproved medication. Unapproved means not approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and/or the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for slaughter animals including that may be destined for human consumption.

**d. Approved Drug Use:** If an animal has been administered a drug that is FDA approved for its species, sufficient time must have passed so that the animal does not test positive for that drug upon arrival to the Grounds. Animals must remain free and clear of all drug and chemical residues while on show grounds. Please note that elimination time (the time it takes for no drug residue to be found in the system) is typically longer than the labeled withdrawal time for most approved drugs.

**e. Animal Inspection & Testing:** As condition for participation in the show, every exhibitor must agree to submit any animal entered by the exhibitor for inspection at any time. Exhibitors agree to have such animal submitted to any test requested by the Show at any time. The exhibitor also agrees that the opinion reached by the Show or its officials as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age shall be final and binding without recourse against the Show or any of its officers. Further, the Show specifically reserves the right to have ultrasound, D.N.A., tissue, blood and/or urine laboratory analysis made on any animal entered for competition. The exhibitor, including his or her parent or guardian or AST or CEA for Junior exhibitors, must be present during the collection for testing and must witness, seal and sign the sample; thus verifying the sample to be properly collected and prepared for analysis. The conclusions reached by the laboratory and/or veterinarian shall be final and binding without recourse against the Show or any of its officers. An exhibitor of an animal that is found to be unethically fitted, over age and/or testing positive for any drug or medication or unapproved chemical may forfeit all rights and privileges to exhibit livestock in the future at the Show.

**f. Unmanageable Animals:** The Show may disqualify any animal deemed unmanageable.

**g. No adherence to Rules:** Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the Show rules will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing in the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo.

**h. Emergency Treatment:** If an animal requires emergency treatment while on Show grounds, only a licensed veterinarian will be allowed to administer any drug, chemical or feed additive. An exhibitor may choose a licensed veterinarian other than the official Show veterinarian, but the official Show veterinarian MUST be notified in advance and he/she MUST be present. Animals which are administered treatments with a withdrawal or extended elimination time period will be disqualified from competition. Furthermore, the Official Show Veterinarian, in agreement with Show Management, reserve the right to treat any animal if, in the opinion of the Official Show Veterinarian, it is in the best interest of the animal's health and well-being to be treated. If the Official Show Veterinarian administers treatment to an animal, and therefore uses any medication that does not meet the appropriate withdrawal and or elimination time, will be determined ineligible to show for competition.

**i. Treatment Cost:** All treatment costs are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

**j. Consequences:** In the event any animal is declared by the veterinarian or testing agency to be unethically fitted the SASSRA President will appoint an Ethics Committee to evaluate the case. The Ethics Committee will make recommendation to SASSRA Board of Directors to permanently bar the exhibitor and his or her family from any further participation in the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo. Reinstatement of anyone barred may be made only by the Board of Directors upon recommendation from the Ethics Committee. The exhibitor will forfeit all titles, awards, prizes, auction proceeds, premiums and scholarships if the animal and/or exhibitor is disqualified. Market/Floor money will be forfeited if the animal is condemned at slaughter. The San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo in cooperation with members of the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association, reserves the right to submit the name(s) of any disqualified exhibitor to the Rule Infraction Database.

**k. Probation:** An exhibitor may be placed on a probationary status if results of drug tests are inconclusive, confirmation of a primary test cannot be granted, or another situation questioning the ethical fitting of livestock arises. The probation grants the right for the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo to collect ultrasound, D.N.A., blood, tissue and/or urine samples for laboratory analysis on any animal entered by an exhibitor on probation at the exhibitor's expense. An exhibitor may remain on probation for any amount of time and may be released from probation only by the Board of Directors upon recommendation from the Ethics Committee.

**23. Rule Infraction Database:** As a member of the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association (NALSARMA), the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo reserves the right to refuse entry to any exhibitor that is entered into the NALSARMA Rule Infraction Database (RID). Furthermore, any exhibitors that violate the rules and regulations of the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo are subject to being reporting to the NALSARMA RID. Information reported to the NALSARMA RID is available to all members of the NALSARMA.

**24. Veterinarians/Medications:** Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type of performance enhancing medication to include but not limited to, steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers are ineligible for competition.

**25. Unauthorized Animals:** Any animals brought onto grounds which are not entered for competition or exhibition will become property of SASSRA and will be disposed of by discretion of the Executive Committee.

**26. Photographs:** Photographs of Champion and Reserve Champion exhibits will be taken by the Official Photographer of the San Angelo Stock Show. Exhibitors of Champion and Reserve Champion winners must make themselves and their exhibits available for the taking of official photographs. Exhibitor hereby grants the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo permission to utilize photograph, image or likeness in whole or in part for use in official San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo publications and promotions.

**27. Objectionable Exhibits:** Show Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal or entry that may be falsely entered, or deemed unsuitable, or objectionable, without assigning a reason therefore. All fees will be forfeited.

**28. Ownership Requirements:** All animals must be entered in the name of the owner(s) as shown on the Registration Certificate. All parties in a multiple ownership must be on the entry form. Firms and partnerships must be in existence at the time of making entry.

All animals in the breeding shows must be recorded or accepted for record in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds, and exhibitors must produce original certificates of registry at the request of the Superintendent of the show at any time during the show or registration for the show. For specific ownership deadline requirements please see the specials rules regarding the specific show.

**29. Animal Care:** All owners or persons in charge of property, or livestock, shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss, shrinkage, or damage to said property or livestock or the owners or exhibitors thereof. The San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo is not responsible for the acts of third parties.

**30. Release Times:** Exhibitors and their animals must remain on the Show grounds until animals are released by the Show Superintendent. An animal on exhibition may not be removed from the grounds prior to its release time without a special order. No animal will be released from the fairgrounds without a proper release form filled out and signed by Show Management. Any violation of this rule will cause forfeiture of all premiums earned by this exhibitor.

**31. Security:** All exhibitors are responsible for security of their own animal(s) until they depart for their final destination (processing/ranch). The exhibitor is the absolute insurer of and is responsible for the condition of their animal(s) regardless of the acts of a third party.

**32. Group Classes:** All group class entries will be made upon arrival at the Show with the Superintendent. There is no entry fee to enter a group class.

**33. Stalling:** All stalls will be assigned upon arrival. Sheep, Goat and Swine stalls assignments will be made at Gate 2. Cattle stalls assignments will be made at the Stall Office in the Cattle Barn which requires entry at Gate 6 off 50<sup>th</sup> Street.

### Exhibitor Conduct and Exhibit Area Rules

**34. Stalls, Pens, Alleys:** Stalls, pens, alleys and exhibit spaces must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day. Dispose of matter in the following ways:

Manure and/or Bedding	Designated Dumpsters
Trash	Trash Barrels

All chairs, equipment boxes, feed, etc. should be kept from the main alleys in the barn and should always allow for through traffic. Lights are not allowed on stalls or pens. Exhibitors are granted access to the barn 24 hours per day, however, exhibitors are not allowed to sleep in the barns.

**35. Signs:** Exhibitors may display a sign over each exhibit advertising their own herds, FFA Chapter or 4-H Club. Signs must be put up in such a way as not to interfere with the exhibit. All forms of signs must be approved by Show Management, and the Livestock Superintendents reserve the right to have to objectionable signs removed.

**36. Feed:** Feed will not be sold on the fairgrounds. You need to bring your feed or plan to purchase feed at local stores after arrival. The San Angelo Stock Show does not guarantee storage space.

**37. Hay:** Any hay fed within the livestock barn must be placed in a feed trough or feed tub in an amount an animal may consume in a single feeding. Free-choice hay is NOT allowed. No hay bags or hay racks will be allowed. Bales of hay will not be allowed in the barn. All hay in the barn must be kept in a container, bucket, or bag from which it cannot spill and must be kept out of aisles. This applies to Livestock Building #2 only (Sheep, Goat, and Swine Barn). Not applicable to Cattle Barn.

**38. Shavings/Bedding:** Bedding is included with stalls. Any and all additional bedding must be purchased from Show Management. No outside shavings will be allowed. Straw will be allowed in for cattle tie-outs only.

**39. Equipment:** Any equipment brought in to be used in the exhibit stall or space must comply with and be used in compliance with all Federal, State, and Municipal Occupation Safety and Health Regulations. Show Management will determine what equipment is allowed on Show grounds.

**a. Scales:** The Show will provide official scales for the use of Junior market exhibitors. Cattle exhibitors are allowed to bring portable scales into the building if they are pad type scales with no sides and they are kept in the stall area. Lamb, Goat and Swine exhibitors are allowed to bring scales as long as kept in stalling area and they allow traffic to flow through the barn. Any violation of this rule will cause scales to be confiscated.

**b. Fans:** Fans are not permitted in the Livestock #2 Building (Sheep, Goat and Swine barn), unless the temperature exceeds 90 degrees Fahrenheit. Announcements will be made regarding this.

**c. Generators:** Generators are not allowed.

**d. Heat Lamps/Propane Heaters:** Heat lamps and propane heaters are not allowed in the barn.

**40. Pets:** Pets are not allowed on the Show grounds. Dogs aiding the handicapped and animals under contract with the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo are exceptions.

## JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW SPECIFIC RULES & REGULATIONS

The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo Association, its officials, directors, employees and agents from hereinafter referred to as **Show Management**.

### Statement of Liability

All exhibits are under the control and direction of the Show Management, but the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo is not responsible to any loss or damage that may occur even as a result of our own negligence. The exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and for its description as given in the catalog. He or she shall indemnify the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as any damage or injury to any other person or property, cause by the exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited with such exhibition or any of the animals exhibited, even if caused by the negligence of the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo. Exhibitor and each signatory hereto, and any servant, agent, family member or employee of the Exhibitor hereby waives all right to sue the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo, even as a result of the Stock Show's negligence.

**Rules:** All general rules apply to all shows within this division, as do the rules stated in the Junior Show Specific Rules and Regulations section and the specific show pages. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know and understand each and all of the rules applicable to them and their exhibits.

**1. Eligibility:** To be eligible in the Junior Livestock Show exhibitors must be Texas residents, members of a Texas 4-H Club or FFA Chapter and enrolled, and attending, public, private or home school elementary or secondary schools. Exhibitors must have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST. Exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 19 on or before August 31, 2011 or 8 years old and in the third grade.

**2. Social Security Number Requirement:** All exhibitors and contestants must have a personal Social Security Number to be eligible to participate in the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo. Social Security Number must be recorded on entry forms.

**3. Ineligible Exhibitors:** Exhibitors placing a Grand Champion Steer, Lamb, Barrow or Wether Goat are not eligible to participate in the respective species in future shows.

**4. Scholastic Eligibility:** All 4-H and FFA members are considered to be eligible by the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo for participation in the Junior Livestock Show at the time entry applications are received from the AST/CEA. Any AST/CEA who has a member that becomes ineligible to participate, for any reason, must provide written and signed notification to Show Management at least 24 hours prior to any Junior Show activity in which the ineligible exhibitor is to participate. If an exhibitor is ineligible, then the entry is ineligible.

**5. Foreign Exchange Students:** Non-United States citizens and Foreign Exchange students are ineligible for competition in the Junior Livestock Division. Such individuals are eligible to participate in the Open Division if all other requirements are met.

**6. Substitute Exhibitors:** All entries in the Junior Show must be exhibited and sold by the owners. Exception: A substitute exhibitor will be allowed to show in place of the owner under the following circumstances:

- ★ When an exhibitor has more than one entry in one class or another entry in the Junior Show and cannot be present.
- ★ When an exhibitor is ill or injured. (Must be accompanied by a doctor's note)

- ★ Approved school activity or TAKS testing (Must be accompanied by a statement from a school official on official school letterhead)

The substitute must be an eligible Junior exhibitor from the same 4-H Club or FFA Chapter entered in the show. Parents, teachers, extension agents or other adults will not be allowed to show.

Substitutions are not allowed for academic ineligibility.

**7. Disqualification:** In the event an exhibitor engages in any conduct which results in disqualification, the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo Association, may, in its sole discretion, prohibit future participation by the exhibitor in any event which is sponsors.

**8. Application for Entry:** All entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be made by the CEA or AST under whose supervision the animals were fed. The CEA or AST must certify on the entry form that the animal and the owner(s) are eligible under the rules of this show. It is the responsibility of the CEA or AST to read all rules and check each entry form carefully before signing it. If entries are not correctly submitted they will be returned.

Entries must be submitted online by the CEA or AST and further directions on steps to follow are available on the website. Once online entries are completed and submitted it is important to print off a summary sheet.

CEA's and AST's must submit the original paper entry form with original signatures from the exhibitor, the exhibitor's parent and/or guardian, and the CEA or AST overseeing the project. Entry forms must also be submitted for all judging teams and Ag mechanics projects and these must be signed by the CEA or AST.

All entries submitted must have original signatures- photocopied or faxed signatures will NOT be accepted. Copying the entries before submitting them for personal records will be allowed.

All entries must be made together and paid by one check payable to the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo, and sent in by the county agent or vocational agriculture teacher with the entry forms. Entries submitted by individual club members will not be accepted. Payment must be in the form of a school check, 4-H club check or money order. Personal checks will not be accepted for junior entries.

**9. Quality Counts Verification:** All junior show exhibitors are required to have gone through the Quality Counts program, complete and pass the on-line test through which they will be assigned a unique verification number. Each exhibitor's verification numbers must be recorded on their entry forms at the time of entry. This rule applies to ALL junior Market Shows and Junior Breeding Shows.

Judging Contests, Agriculture Mechanics, and Ag Speaking Contest exhibitors are exempt from this requirement. Though it is strongly encouraged, Youth Boer Goat and Youth Longhorn exhibitors will not be required to take this test.

**10. Refunds:** Refunds will not be made for any reason.

**11. Wholesome Meat Act:** The USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to all market livestock. Only animals eligible for immediate slaughter may be brought onto the grounds and exhibited:

- Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residues.
- Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
- If drug or chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned.

The San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo will in no way be liable or responsible for the condition of the carcasses or the sale price of the animal. In such cases, the exhibitor forfeits all rights to any and all proceeds including: Auction Price, Scholarships, Premium Awards, Market (Floor) Price and Special Awards.

**12. Market Animal Eligibility:** Any and all market animals entered and/or exhibited must be bred, born and raised in the United States of America. Please check specific show rules for additional eligibility regulations on market animals, such as Junior Market Lambs and Junior Market Barrows must be Texas bred.

**13. Terminal Shows:** This is a terminal show for market lambs, market barrows, wether goats and steers placing 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup>. All market lambs, market barrows, wether goats and 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place steers must go to the market. Non-placing steers may be sold at the market price or they may be released.

**14. Sift, Non-Place, Premium and Auction Checks:** Owners will be paid by the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo for sifted and non-placing animals based on weigh-in weight. Checks will be mailed directly from the San Angelo Stock Show. If applicable, premium monies for class placings will be distributed by the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo and mailed with sifted and non-placing checks to the 4-H or FFA address. Auction sale checks will be issued by the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo and may be mailed separate from premium checks and floor checks directly to the exhibitors mailing address.

**15. Bedding:** Bedding is included with stalls. Any and all additional bedding must be purchased from Show Management. No outside shavings will be allowed. Straw will be allowed in for cattle tie-outs only.

**16. Weighing:** Market steer, barrow, lamb and wether goat exhibitors will turn in their official show weight. The management reserves the right to weigh-back any animal at any time. Animals not weighing within the defined range set forth by the specific show rules are subject to a \$10.00/cwt fee.

**17. Health Papers:** Health papers are not required for junior market animals; however, they are required for all breeding animals and will be checked at the gate of entry.

## ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

San Angelo Stock Show officials are allowed to impose animal health requirements that are more restrictive than those imposed by the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC). Specific TAHC regulations will supercede the Show requirements if there is a dispute between the two in which the Show rules are less restrictive than TAHC regulations. The show considers itself an interstate (accepting entries of livestock from within Texas and from other states) show for livestock entries. Exhibitors with livestock originating outside the State of Texas are encouraged to contact their state Animal Health officials to confirm specific requirements, if any, their state may impose on animals returning from a Texas show.

**CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION:** The certificate must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations or treatments required by the Commission were completed. For certain diseases, a specific statement may be required indicating disease free status. The certificate is required to accompany animals and fowl entering the State of Texas as stated in the following summary of entry requirements. The certificate is valid for 45 days for equine and 30 days for all other species.

**PRIOR ENTRY PERMITS:** Entry permits are required as noted in the following summary of entry requirements. Permits may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777 (24 hours), or 1/800-550-8242 or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 Kramer Lane, P.O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.

### ROUTINE INSPECTION PROCEDURES

1. Representatives of the Show should meet all incoming livestock vehicles at entry gate to Show Grounds.
2. At this point, all required documents will be inspected as well as a visual inspection of the shipment.
3. If shipment meets all requirements, the driver will then be allowed on grounds.
4. If the shipment does NOT meet the requirements, they will be asked to pull from the flow of traffic. Show Officials will then take necessary steps to correct the issue or dismiss the animals from premises. However at NO time will these animals be allowed on grounds to co-mingle with others.

### CATTLE

#### *BEEF CATTLE*

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days if any out-of-state cattle are exhibited.

#### *JUNIOR MARKET STEERS*

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is **NOT** required.

### GOATS

#### *OPEN & JUNIOR BREEDING GOATS (Texas Origin & Out of State Origin)*

##### *Junior Angora Wether Goats*

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current within thirty (30) days.
2. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification.
3. Registered animals may use a registration tattoo or electronic identification (accompanied by reader) "as official identification"; as long as registration papers accompany the animal with the Scrapie Premise ID number.

#### *JUNIOR MARKET GOATS*

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is **NOT** required.

### **SHEEP**

#### *TEXAS ORIGIN SHEEP (Jr. Breeding Sheep, Open Breeding Sheep, Ewe Lambs)*

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.
2. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification.

#### *OUT OF STATE ORIGIN SHEEP (Jr. Breeding Sheep, Open Breeding Sheep, Ewe Lambs)*

1. Must meet the same requirements as for Texas Origin Sheep.
2. Negative ELISA brucella ovis test within thirty (30) days for all breeding rams 6 months of age or older. Each ram shall be individually identified with an individual ear tag or registration tattoo. This number, along with the test results and name of the approved laboratory and date of test, shall be entered on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Exemption for rams from a certified brucella ovis free flock and Texas origin rams; certified flock number must be recorded on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
3. All blackface ovine females and all blackface crossbred females, except hair sheep, imported into the State of Texas for breeding purposes shall originate from a Scrapie Certified Free Flock or have documentation supporting that the animals are of the genotype RR at codon 171 or AA at codon 136 and QR at codon 171.

#### *JUNIOR MARKET LAMBS*

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is **NOT** required.

### **SWINE**

#### *JUNIOR BREEDING GILTS*

1. All certificates must be issued on or after January 16, 2012, with the following information:
  - A. Leptospirosis vaccination is required on breeding swine, 6 months of age and older, within 30 days prior to entry (on or after January 16, 2012) with vaccine containing the following strains: Canicola, Hardjo, Icterohaemorrhagiae, Grippotyphosa, and Pomona. Vaccination date must appear on the health certificate.
  - B. A statement must appear that says the animal has not been fed garbage, has not been exposed to hog cholera or pseudorabies, does not originate from a quarantined herd, nor has the herd of origin had PRV within the last six months, nor have the entries themselves been vaccinated for PRV.

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is **NOT** required.

1. The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo Association will not be responsible for any accidents connected with this contest.
2. Qualifications for contestants:
  - A. The first 60 complete and correct entries received in the Stock Show Office will be eligible. (Entry deadline: December 15, 2011)
  - B. Ages 13-18. Must have reached 13<sup>th</sup>, but not 19<sup>th</sup> birthday on or by February 1, 2012.
  - C. Open to all 4-H and FFA contestants in the state of Texas.
  - D. Must have been actively participating in Texas 4-H Club work for one year prior to February 1, 2012 or enrolled in a Texas Vocational Agricultural class for the fall term just preceding.
  - E. Contestants will be selected by 4-H and FFA supervisors.
  - F. No contestant will be permitted to contest more than one time in any one year at the San Angelo Stock Show.
3. There will be three (3) go-rounds, one each during performances on Saturday, February 18<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 p.m., Sunday, February 19<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 p.m. and Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7:00 p.m. The top 4 in each go-round (12 total) will compete on Saturday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in the Scholarship Scramble.
4. There will be a five (5) minute time limit to catch a calf and lead it across the finish line. If after five minutes calves remain, one (1) minute will be allowed to catch and halter a calf. At this time, if any remain, the one (1) minute will be allowed to catch a calf. Judges will score according to this time frame and decisions of the committee are final.
5. Buckles will be awarded to the first place winner in the first three go-rounds.
6. Ten (10) calves will be turned into the arena the first 3 go-rounds, with 6 in the Scholarship Scramble. Contestants and calves will be placed in the arena as determined by management.
7. Contestants will carry into the arena a snap-on lead rope. A halter will already be placed on the animals with no lead. Contestants must catch the calf, clip on the lead rope and walk the animal across the finish line. No shoes with spikes, cleats or knobs on soles can be worn.
8. Contestants will not be allowed to work as a "team", but each contestant will attempt to catch and lead one of the calves. Each contestant catching a calf will be required to lead that calf across the finish line without aid. After catching a calf and placing the lead on the calf, the contestant will not be permitted to fasten the rope to himself/herself in any manner to aid in leading the calf over the finish line. If two or more contestants catch the same calf, they will be ordered by the referee to release the calf.

9. If a contestant has hold of a calf, no other contestant will be allowed to touch the calf unless and until it breaks away. If a calf is caught by the tail, the contestant catching the calf shall be allowed a reasonable amount of time to place the halter; however, at the direction of the referee, the contestant will let the calf go.

10. Poor sportsmanship will disqualify any contestant automatically and undue roughness will not be tolerated by the referee. This scramble will be refereed by a group of not less than four (4) referees.

11. Each contestant must submit a Minor's Release to the Stock Show Association through his/her County Extension Agent or Ag Science Teacher. After all releases are checked and accepted by the Stock Show, each contestant will be notified of his/her acceptance as a contestant and the date and time he/she is to participate.

12. The Interscholastic League State Executive Committee, in cooperation with the State Board of Vocational Education has formulated a plan permitting calf scrambles and still protecting a contestant's amateur standing. This is done by placing the matter under the supervision of the Vocational Agricultural Department of the school and 4-H Club supervisors, and prohibiting the participants from receiving anything of cash value for winning the athletic part of the program.

13. Go-round scramble awards: A purchase certificate will be issued to each of the ten (10) contestants catching a calf in one of the three go-rounds in the following amounts:

1 <sup>st</sup> - Advance to Finals*	3 <sup>rd</sup> - Advance to Finals*	5 <sup>th</sup> - \$110	7 <sup>th</sup> - \$80	9 <sup>th</sup> - \$60
2 <sup>nd</sup> - Advance to Finals*	4 <sup>th</sup> - Advance to Finals*	6 <sup>th</sup> - \$100	8 <sup>th</sup> - \$70	10 <sup>th</sup> - \$50

\*Top Four advance to Finals and are guaranteed at least a \$250 certificate.

14. Scholarship Scramble Awards: Scholarships will be awarded places 1-6 in the Scholarship Scramble with places 7-12 receiving additional purchase certificates. Scholarships will be awarded in full upon receipt of proof of enrollment in a Texas vocational/technical school or accredited Texas College or University.

4. All exhibitors from Grand Champion down through second place must attend the sale. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Overall will walk through the sale ring with animals. All other breed champions, reserve breed champions, first and second places must be present at the sale. Exhibitors placing third and lower will not present in the sale ring. Exhibitors with animals placing third or lower will be guaranteed a sale price at a date close to the premium sale and will be eligible for add-ons.

5. A substitute exhibitor will be allowed to show in place of the owner under the following circumstances:

- ★ When an exhibitor is ill or injured. **(Must be accompanied by a doctor's note)**
- ★ Approved school activity or TAKS testing. **(Must be accompanied by a statement from a school official on school letterhead.)**

All documentation must be presented prior to the onset of the premium sale to Show Management. A substitute exhibitor from the same county/FFA who does not already have a position in the sale will be allowed to present in the ring.

6. The Stock Show and Rodeo Association guarantees each steer sold in the Premium Sale a price of \$500 above the packer price, provided a packer bid is available.

7. There will be no guaranteed minimum price for the market lambs, barrows or wether goats.

8. There will be no charge for this sale. Junior Exhibitors selling animals in the Premium Sale will receive payment by check, by mail after the show closes and upon payment by the buyer for the full amount of the price.

9. Animals that are not sold through the auction ring cannot be bought back by the exhibitor. Any exhibitor, or anyone acting for an exhibitor, who is found guilty of asking a purchaser to either give him his animal or sell it back to him will be barred from further participation in this show and forfeit all premiums and sale money above market value of the animal.

10. Any animal which has sold at auction at any major livestock show is not eligible for the sale.

1. All rules apply to the Junior Barrow Show. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules.

2. To be eligible to exhibit in the 2012 Barrow Show, all barrows must be validated in the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program. Each entry must have been recorded on a 4-H or FFA Swine Validation Form Master List between November 1 and November 30. Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their barrows continuously since November 30, 2011.

A hair follicle sample will be collected from all breed champions and all reserve breed champions and a DNA analysis will be conducted on each of these samples. The Barrow Show Committee may also collect a hair sample from any other barrow entry for the purpose of conducting a DNA analysis. Any barrow not having a positive match from the DNA analysis of this hair follicle sample, compared to the DNA analysis of the hair follicle sample taken at the time of enrollment in the validation program, will be disqualified.

Validation tags will be used for identification. Separate tags will not be issued.

3. The Barrow Show will be a Texas Bred Show only. All entries must have been bred in Texas and present a Certified Texas Bred Registry Certificate at the show. Entries without a valid Texas Bred Certificate will be disqualified. Certificates may be obtained by contacting the breeder the barrow was purchased from.

4. Previous exhibitors of the Grand Champion Barrow are not eligible to enter the Junior Barrow Show.

5. Each exhibitor will be permitted to enter no more than two (2) barrows.

6. Pen assignments will be made upon arrival.

7. At check-in exhibitors will be given the Barrow Disposition Form in its entirety. Check-in must be completed by 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, February 14, 2012 and disposition cards must be turned in with weight, breed and validation number by the County Agents and Ag Teachers by 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, February 14, 2012. There will be no official weigh in. There will be no preset weight breaks.

8. Barrows weighing less than 230 pounds or more than 270 pounds will be sifted.

9. The Barrow Show Superintendent will have the right to weigh any animal in the barn at anytime. Any animal not weighing within 10 pounds of the weight turned in will be sifted and assessed a \$10.00 cwt. penalty. Any re-weighed barrow weighing less than 230 pounds will be sifted.

10. Barrows will be designated for re-weighing during judging in the show arena at a time designated by the Superintendent. Any barrow leaving the show ring and later returning for additional judging will be re-weighed. Any barrow weighing more than 10 pounds above his initial official show weight will become ineligible for any award or the premium sale.

11. Class 39 will be a floating class given to the Yorkshire, White OPB or Black OPB breed division based on the division with the most entries. Whichever, of those breed divisions has the most weighed in entries will receive the fourth class and associated sale slots.
12. There will be no clipping of barrows after arrival. No artificial color, paste, powder, oil or other dressing is allowed.
13. There will be no washing of feed pans in the wash rack at any time. Do not dump or wash pans inside the barn. Dumpsters will be located just outside the barn for excess feed and trash.
14. The Junior Market Barrow Show is a terminal show. All barrows arriving at the show must be sold (included sifted, non-placing and ribbon winning barrows) according to show procedure.
15. All barrows remain the property of the exhibitor until they are loaded on the packer truck. Any unethical practice will release the show from liability and remains the responsibility of the exhibitor. In the event the Stock Show is unable to obtain an adequate packer bid, all animals will remain in the possession of the exhibitor and will be taken home by the exhibitor.
16. The Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, first, second and third places must sell in the Premium Sale and will not receive any additional premium monies.
17. Health Certificates are not required.

Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their steers continuously since June 30, 2011.

A hair follicle sample will be collected from all breed champions and all reserve breed champions and DNA analysis will be conducted on each of these hair follicle samples. The Steer Committee may also collect a hair follicle sample from any other steer entry from the purpose of conducting a DNA analysis. Any steer not having a positive match from the DNA analysis of this hair follicle sample, compared to the DNA analysis of the hair follicle sample taken from it at the time of enrollment in the validation program will be disqualified. The first and second place steers in each class will be nose printed. The Steer Committee may also nose print any other steer entry for the purpose of identification.

Steers arriving at the show without an official Texas Steer Tag must be validated by the Steer Committee. The official State Validation tags will be the show tag. Separate tags will not be issued.

3. Previous exhibitors of the Grand Champion Steer are not eligible to enter the Junior Steer Show.
4. Each exhibitor will be permitted to enter no more than two (2) steers.
5. Steers will be stalled in the Cattle Barn located North-East of the Coliseum. Enter Gate 6 off of 50<sup>th</sup> Street. Stalling assignments will be made upon arrival.
6. At check-in exhibitors will be given the Steer Disposition Form in its entirety. Check-in must be completed by 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 15, 2012 and disposition cards must be turned in with weight, breed and validation number by the County Agents and Ag Teachers by 6:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 15, 2012. There will be no official weigh in. There will be no preset weight breaks.
7. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1000 pounds. Any steer weighed in under this will be sifted.
8. The Steer Show Superintendent will have the right to weigh any animal in the barn at anytime. Any animal not weighing within 5% of the weight turned in will be sifted and assessed a \$10.00 cwt. penalty. Any re-weighed steer weighing less than 1000 pounds will be sifted.
9. Steers will be designated for re-weighing during judging in the show arena at a time designated by the Superintendent. Any steer leaving the show ring and later returning for additional judging will be re-weighed. Any steer weighing more than 5% above his initial official show weight will become ineligible for any award or the premium sale.
10. Steers will be shown in three breed classifications. These three breed classifications are: English Breeds, American Breed & Crosses and European Breeds & Crosses. Purebred Hereford, Polled Hereford, Angus, Red Angus and Shorthorn will be classified as English breeds. Steers that exhibit visibly obvious characteristics of Bos

indicus genetics that support the commercial industry will be classified as American Breeds & Crosses. Steers not classified as English breeds or American Breed & Crosses will be classified as European Breed & Crosses.

11. A three-man classifying system will be used for classifying all steers.

12. No sifted steers will be sold. All sifted steers are required to leave ground immediately.

13. All steers to be floored should be taken to the floor pen, outside the show arena, immediately following their class. All floored animals MUST be in the designated area by thirty minutes after the selection of the Grand Champion Steer. After the thirty minute time period following the show, animals are not guaranteed the ability to be floored. Steers may not be floored without a valid and correct disposition form.

14. All steers must be shorn prior to arrival at the fairgrounds. Hair must not exceed ¼" on any location of the body excluding the tail switch.

15. No trimming on the grounds. No trim chutes.

17. Steers must be halter broken, trained and fitted to show.

18. The Champion steer from each breed division will compete for Grand Champion Steer. Reserve Champion steers from each breed division are required to be brought into the arena. The Reserve Champion Steer from the breed division furnishing the Grand Champion Steer will become eligible to compete for Reserve Grand Champion Steer.

19. The Grand Champion Steer, Reserve Grand Champion Steer and all first and second place steers must sell in the premium sale, and will not receive any additional premiums. The Stock Show & Rodeo Association guarantees each steer sold in the Premium Sale a premium price of \$500.00 above the packer bid, provided a packer bid available.

20. Health papers are not required.

Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their animals continuously since October 31, 2011.  
  
Hair follicle samples will be collected from all Breed Champions and all Reserve Champions, and a DNA analysis will be conducted on each of these hair follicle samples. The Lamb Committee may also collect hair follicle samples from any other lamb entry for the purpose of conducting a DNA analysis. Any lamb not having a positive match from the DNA analysis of the hair follicle samples, compared to the DNA analysis of the hair follicle sample taken from it at the time of enrollment in the validation program, will be disqualified.  
  
The validation tag will be the show tag. A separate tag will not be issued.
3. To be eligible to exhibit in the 2012 Junior Market Lamb Show, a lamb must be bred by a member of the Texas Lamb Breeder's Association, and have an official TLBA tag in its ear. Tags are to be obtained from the breeder of the lamb. TLBA tags must be present in the ear of the animal at the time of validation through the Texas 4-H and FFA Lamb Validation Program and must be recorded on official validation paperwork. TLBA tags must be present in the lamb's ear at the show as well.
4. Previous exhibitors of the Grand Champion Lamb are ineligible to enter the Market Lamb Show.
5. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter five (5) total lambs, with no more than two (2) per breed. ONLY wethers may be shown.
6. Lambs will be stalled in the Livestock Barn #2. Enter Gate 2 and unload on the West side of the building. Pens will be assigned upon arrival. To pen with someone, you must arrive together – no holding of pens will be allowed.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for turning in correct weight and breed on official disposition form to be submitted in its entirety to show personnel, who will then give the exhibitor a portion back that will be required for placement on the truck. Superintendents will break classes immediately following the weight card deadline. Classes will be broken into schedule listed below. There will be no pre-set weight breaks.
8. Finewool, Finewool Cross and Medium Wool lambs weighing less than 100 pounds and Southdown and Hair Sheep lambs weighing less than 90 pounds will be sifted. There will be no upper weight limit.
9. Lambs will be designated for re-weighing during judging in the show arena at a time determined by the Market Lamb Show Superintendent. Any lamb weighing more than 5 pounds above or below his initial official show weight will become ineligible for any award or premium sale and may be assessed a \$10.00 cwt. penalty. The 5 pound weigh back is over and under.
10. There is no tooth rule.

11. Three man classifying system will be used. Lambs that are classified out will progress to the appropriate breed division. Finewools classified will advance to Finewool Cross, and Finewool Cross, Southdowns, and Hair Sheep classified will advance to the Medium Wool Division. Exhibitors should be familiar with the current Classification Guidelines for market lambs.
12. All lambs must be shorn prior to arrival on grounds. The pelt must be uniform in length over entire body at the time of showing. Boots will be optional and no top knots will be allowed.

Hair follicle samples will be collected from the first place wether goat in each class. Should the Reserve Grand champion wether goat come out of the same class as the Grand Champion Wether Goat, then the second place class winner will also have hair follicle samples collected. The Wether Goat Committee may also collect hair follicle samples from any other wether goat entry for the purpose of conducting a DNA analysis. Any wether goat not having a positive match from the DNA analysis of this hair follicle sample, compared to the DNA analysis of the hair follicle sample taken from it at the time of enrollment in the validation program, will be disqualified.  
  
Validation tags will be used. A separate tag will not be issued.
3. Previous exhibitors of the Grand Champion Wether Goat are ineligible to enter the Junior Wether Goat Show.
4. Goats will be stalled in the Livestock Barn #2. Enter Gate 2 and unload on the West side of the building. Pens will be assigned upon arrival. To pen with someone, you must arrive together – no holding of pens will be allowed.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for turning in correct weight on official disposition form to be submitted in its entirety to show personnel, who will then give the exhibitor a portion back that will be required for placement on the truck. Superintendents will break classes immediately following the weigh-in. Classes will be broken into 10 weight classes. There will be no pre-set weight breaks.
6. Wether goats must weigh a minimum of 60 pounds and maximum of 115 pounds. Only wethers may be shown.
7. The Goat Show Superintendent has the right to weigh any entry at any time. Goats will be designated for re-weighting during the judging. Any entry weighing more or less than 4 pounds above or below the initial official show weight will become ineligible for any award or premium sale and may be assessed a \$10 cwt penalty.
8. There is no tooth rule.
9. Wethers must be UNIFORMLY shorn 3/8" or less above the knee and hock joints before arrival on the grounds. NO clipping will be allowed on the grounds. Removal of horns on grounds is not permitted. No sharp points allowed on horns.
10. No painting, powdering, or artificial coloring is allowed.

1. All rules apply to the Texas Stars Junior Gilt Show. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules.
2. The Texas Stars Junior Gilt Show is open to gilts only. They must have been bred, farrowed and raised in Texas and have a CTBR Certificate. CTBR Certificates are furnished to eligible breeders, so exhibitors should request the certificate from the breeder of the animal.
3. PUREBRED GILTS- In addition to a CTBR Certificate, exhibitors with Pedigreed gilts will be required to present original registration certificates which indicate the gilt to be Texas Bred. Animals must be registered in the herd book of their association in the name of the junior owner on or before December 1<sup>st</sup>, the year preceding the show. Superintendents will collect original registration certificates at check-in. **In addition to the original copy of the registration certificate the exhibitor will be required to furnish a photo-copy for show ring verification purposes.**
4. All gilts entered in the Texas Stars Junior Gilt Show must be validated in the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program. Gilts must be listed on an official Swine Validation Form between November 1 and November 30. Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their animals continuously since November 30, 2011. Show management will make the final decision regarding any potential disqualification.
5. There is no limit on the number of entries each exhibitor may enter, as long as each entry meets all requirements.
6. Health papers along with other testing will be required, as some of these animals have potential to be leaving the state. Please check Animal Health Regulations for the 2012 Stock Show for complete requirements for all gilts exhibited in the 2012 Show. Health papers must be submitted to show officials at check-in when papers are checked or weights are turned in, whichever is applicable.

- B. A statement must appear that says the animal has not been fed garbage, has not been exposed to hog cholera or pseudorabies, does not originate from a quarantined herd, nor has the herd of origin had PRV within the last six months, nor have the entries themselves been vaccinated for PRV.

**7. Original health papers must be furnished by the exhibitor at check-in. If more than one gilt is listed on the original health paper, the exhibitor must furnish additional photo-copies for each gilt listed. Please make copies before arrival.**

**8. Pedigreed Division:** Purebred classes will be broken by age following check-in. Gilts must have been farrowed between July 1<sup>st</sup> and September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2011. Classes will be divided equally, with not more than three classes per breed. If 30 head or more arrive, the breed will be divided into three classes. If less than 30 head arrive, the breed will be broken into two classes. Purebreds will follow an 8 breed format, with these breeds being eligible: Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, Spots, Poland China, Berkshire, Landrace, and Chester Whites. *Any breed that has 10 or more pedigreed animals entered will be judged as a separate breed. Breeds with less than 10 pedigreed animals entered will be judged in the OPB class.* The number of divisions/classes of the OPB's will be determined by the superintendent. In the event two breeds must be combined into an OPB class, they will follow the last purebred breed division with 15 head.

**9. Non-Pedigreed Division:** Classes will be broken by weight following the weight card deadline. Classes will be divided as evenly as possible, with no less than 15 head per any class. Gilts will be divided into three major divisions by weight: Light, Medium and Heavy. Depending on the number of crossbred gilts, show management reserves the right to establish additional classes within these major divisions.

Non-pedigreed gilts must weigh a minimum of 230 pounds and there is no maximum weight. Weight cards shall be turned in by 7:00 p.m., February 11, 2012 and all non-pedigreed gilts eligible for placing will be subject to re-weigh. There will be a 10 pound weigh-back on both the top and bottom. If a gilt does not weigh within 10 pounds of turned in weight, it will be disqualified.

**10. Champion Drives:** All pedigreed breed champions and reserve breed champions will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Pedigreed Gilt. All three major weight division champions in the Non-Pedigreed Division will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Non-Pedigreed Gilt. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Pedigreed Gilt and the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Non-Pedigreed Gilt will compete for Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion.

**11. Sale:** Approximately 60 gilts will be eligible to sell in the CTBR Texas Stars Gilt Sale. **All gilts selected to the sale must sell- no exceptions.** Sale order will be determined by the judge(s). There is no limit to the number of head an exhibitor may sell. All gilts will sell as is, the show management or the TPPA makes no guarantees. A 15% commission will be collected on each gilt in the sale to assist in marketing expenses for the event. **Please review the Select Gilt Sale rules page.**

**12. Non-Sale Gilts:** Gilts that are not selected for the CTBR Texas Stars Select Gilt Sale will be released and considered "take-home." All non-sale gilts must leave the facility one hour after the selection of Supreme and Reserve Supreme Champion Gilt. Stock Show releases will be required and may be obtained from the show superintendents or designated personnel.

**13. Incentives:** Each breed champion in the Pedigreed Division and each of the three (3) major division winners in the Non-Pedigreed Division will receive a \$500 incentive. Each reserve breed champion in the Pedigreed Division and each of the three (3) major division reserve champions in the Non-Pedigreed Division will receive a \$250 incentive.

**14. Scholarships:** The Texas Pork Producers will provide \$4.00 per entry to be divided into scholarship money. The Supreme Champion Gilt will receive 40% of the funds, the Reserve Supreme Champion Gilt will receive 30% of the funds and the two gilts left from the Supreme Champion drive will receive 15% each. Only the Champion Pedigreed Gilt, Reserve Champion Pedigreed Gilt, Champion Non-Pedigreed Gilt and Reserve Champion Non-Pedigreed Gilt will be eligible to participate in the Supreme Champion Drive.

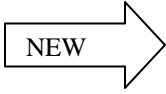

1. All rules apply to the Junior Ewe Lamb Futurity. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules.
2. An exhibitor may initially start with as many as four registered or commercial Finewool ewe lambs, but is allowed to show only one pair of ewe lambs. Ewe lambs must be in possession of, fed, and cared for by the exhibitor. Ewe lambs must be halter broke. Health papers are required, please check Animal Health Regulations for complete details.
3. Ewe lambs must be sheared and validated on or after October 20, 2011. Each ewe lamb must be identified with a numbered tag.
4. Fall or spring born ewe lambs may be shown.
5. For purposes of records and record form, October 20, 2011 will be considered the beginning date of the Ewe Lamb Futurity project.
6. Each ewe lamb must be weighed at the beginning (October 20, 2011 – shorn weight) and end (February 23, 2012 – unshorn weight) of the project and must gain at least 30 pounds during this period. One point for every pound under 30 pounds will be deducted from the score sheets.
7. Exhibitors must weigh their lambs at 6:00 p.m., February 23, and turn in their record forms. At 8:00 a.m., February 24 exhibitors must tie their lambs in the arena for judging. Three judges will evaluate ewes in full fleeces, after which time they will be shorn. Judges will then evaluate fleeces and shorn ewe lambs.
8. Exhibitors will be required to keep records for the duration of the project. They will also be required to take a test and judge a class of finewool ewes and a class of wool fleeces at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, February 24<sup>th</sup>, to determine their knowledge of general sheep production. Record forms, and a study guide and study questions should be picked up at your County Extension office or the Stock Show office by the initiation date of October 20<sup>th</sup>.

1. All rules apply to the Junior Breeding Sheep Show. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules.
2. Each entry form must show the full name, address, and social security number of the exhibitor, the name of the breed and number of head entered. It will not be necessary to give the name of the animal, registry number or name of sire and dam until the certificate of registry is presented to the superintendent. Certificates of registry must be furnished to the superintendent before the animals enter the ring. Affidavits in lieu of registration certificates will not be accepted.
3. All breeding sheep must be registered in the Flock Books of their respective breeds, and bear such identification as that association requires, by October 1, 2011. Sheep not carrying ear tags or tattoos at time of showing will be barred from competition.
4. To be eligible to exhibit in the 2012 Junior Breeding Sheep Show, all sheep must be validated in the Texas 4-H and FFA Breeding Sheep Validation Program. Hair follicle samples will be collected from all Breed Champions and all Reserve Champions, and a DNA analysis will be conducted on each of these hair follicle samples. The Junior Breeding Sheep Show committee may also collect hair follicle samples from any other entry for the purpose of conducting a DNA analysis. Any sheep not having a positive match from the DNA analysis of the hair follicle samples, compared to the DNA analysis of the hair follicle sample taken from it at the time of enrollment in the validation program, will be disqualified. Nose prints will also be taken on all sheep at validation and those prints may be verified at the show. All breeding sheep will be validated in individual exhibitor names and not by families. No partnerships allowed.
5. The breeder of an animal is the owner of the dam at the time of service. If a boy or girl showing sheep in the registered class is such a breeder, his or her lamb must be registered in the boy's or girl's name by opening day of the show.
6. If a boy or a girl is showing a sheep in the registered classes that is a gift from some breeder, the transfer certificate must be dated on Association records on or before October 1, of the year preceding the show.
7. Classes are provided for lambs and two-tooth sheep. Sheep in the Lamb Classes must retain all lamb teeth and be at least 6 months of age. Sheep which have dropped one or more milk teeth, or show one or both teeth of the permanent pair of incisors, are eligible only in the Two-Tooth Classes. Sheep with more than two visible permanent incisors will not be eligible to show in this division. In order to be able to move a ewe lamb or buck lamb up, you must fill the lamb class first.
8. Each junior exhibitor is entitled to enter four (4) Rams and four (4) Ewes in each breed division in the Junior Breeding Show; however, each exhibitor may show only two (2) Rams or two (2) Ewes in each single class and one group in each group class.
9. The judge making awards must have the clerk record the ear tag number of each animal awarded a prize.
10. Only first place winners shall compete for champion animal. The second place winner in the class from which the champion animal was selected will compete for reserve champion animal.

11. Pen assignments will be made by the pen stewards at time of arrival. One pen will be assigned per two entries.
12. The same sheep MAY compete in both Junior and Open Shows.
13. Livestock exhibitors will be allowed to display signs over exhibits advertising their own herds. This is only allowed in livestock barns.
14. No unloading on the East side of the barns.
15. All sheep entered in the Junior Rambouillet Show must be shorn on or after October 20<sup>th</sup> of the year preceding the show. No boots. Fleece length must be uniform over body.
16. Dorpers and White Dorpers will show together.
17. The exhibitor of the Grand Champion Rambouillet Ewe, Delaine Ewe and Dorper Ewe will receive a \$500.00 incentive. The exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion Rambouillet Ewe, Delaine Ewe and Dorper Ewe will receive a \$250.00 incentive. Incentive recipients may enter future shows and may receive another incentive. Exhibitors must be present to be awarded the incentive.
18. Pay-Out. Checks will be mailed to the agent/instructor following the show.

2. The exhibitors' CEA/AST must validate the goats were shorn on or after August 1, 2011, and the animal must be owned by the exhibitor on or before October 1, 2011.
3. Health Certificates are required; please check the 2012 Animal Health Regulations for more information.
4. All goats entered must be wethers.
5. The show will consist of three separate weight classes that will be broken after weigh-in.
6. All animals exhibited will be micron tested. Samples for micron testing will be taken during weigh-in. Results will be posted prior to beginning of show.
7. Each class will be shown with the animal in full fleece. The judge will select the ten overall animals. These animals will be shorn and then re-judged. Each animal will then be placed accordingly. Designated shearers will be provided to shear each animal.
8. The fleeces will be weighed, micron tested, and analyzed objectively with scientific instruments to determine the characteristics and value of each entire fleece.
9. The animals will be judged both in the fleece and out of the fleece.
  - a. 1/3 of the total score will be calculated from "in fleece" judging
  - b. 1/3 of the total score will be calculated from "fleece" judging
  - c. 1/3 of the total score will be calculated from the "out of fleece" judging
10. The mohair fleeces will be placed based upon overall value. There will be price valuations given to each fleece based upon micron. The micron categories will break as follows:
  - 28 micron or less
  - 28 – 30 micron
  - 30 – 32 micron
  - 32 or greaterBased on actual marked prices each fleece will be given a value and placing based upon real market prices on the day of the show for each micron category.
11. A formula will be used to calculate class placings. The collective score from the three classes will determine the placing of each animal.

If the goat is recorded direct to the boy or girl, the certificate of Registry must be dated before December 1 of the year preceding the show.
6. All goats will show by the birth date on American Goat Breeders Association Registration papers.
7. Each exhibitor may show only two (2) Bucks or two (2) Does in each single class. Certificates of Registry must be furnished to the Superintendent before animals enter the ring.
8. The judge making awards must have the clerk record ear number, ear tag, or tattoo of all animals awarded prizes.
9. All Angora Goats must be machine shorn to the skin on or after August 1 of the calendar year preceding the show.
10. Only first place animals shall compete for the champion animal. The second place winner in the class from which the champion animal was selected will compete for reserve champion.
11. The exhibitor of the Champion Angora Doe exhibitor is eligible to receive a \$1,000.00 scholarship. Hair follicle samples will be collected from the first place doe in each class. The Junior Texas Stars Doe Show Committee and Show Management may also collect hair follicle samples from any other doe entry for the purpose of conducting a DNA analysis. Any doe not having a positive match from the DNA analysis of this hair follicle sample, compared to the DNA analysis of the hair follicle sample taken from it at the time of enrollment in the validation program, will be disqualified.
3. All entries must be owned and the bona fide project of a boy or girl, regularly enrolled in a Texas 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, by October 31, of the year preceding the show, and must have been personally fed and cared for under the supervision of a County Agent or Teacher of Vocational Agriculture.
4. Health papers along with other testing will be required. Please check Animal Health Regulations for the 2012 Stock Show for complete requirements for all does exhibited in the 2012 Show. Health papers must be submitted to show officials at check-in when papers are checked or weights are turned in, whichever is applicable.  
Animal Health Regulations for Does
  1. All certificates must be issued on or after January 22, 2012, with the following information:
    - A. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification.
5. There is a limit of three entries per exhibitor.
6. Goats will be stalled in the Livestock Barn #2. Enter Gate 2 and unload on the West side of the building. Pens will be assigned upon arrival. To pen with someone, you must arrive together – no holding of pens will be allowed.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for turning in correct weight on an official weight card to be submitted in its entirety to show personnel. Superintendents will break classes immediately following the weigh-in. Classes will be broken into no more than 9 weight classes in three divisions. **The number of classes is up to the discretion of the committee and show officials based on the number of entries.** There will be no pre-set weight breaks.
8. Does must weigh a minimum of 50 pounds and there is no maximum. Only does may be shown.

9. The Doe Show Superintendent has the right to weigh any entry at any time. Goats will be designated for re-weighing during the judging. Any entry weighing more than 5 pounds above or below the initial official show weight will become ineligible for any award or premium sale.
10. At the time of show, does must not possess more than their first set of yearling teeth.
11. Dehorning of the goats is not suggested, however, horns should be tipped and rounded. Goats with horns sharper than deemed safe by the show superintendent or Show Management will be required to be tipped or rounded or the animal will be isolated and not shown.
12. This is a "Blow and Go" show. Blocking tables and blowers will be permitted. Battery powered clippers will be allowed for touch-ups only. All does must be clipped prior to arrival. Hair length of the animal is left up to the discretion of the exhibitor.
13. No painting, powdering, or artificial coloring is allowed.
14. No electrical equipment of any kind is allowed. HAY, HEAT LAMPS, ICE PACKS, OR PROPANE HEATERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARNES!!
16. GOATS MAY BE WASHED AFTER ARRIVAL.
17. No external parasites will be allowed. If a goat is found to have external parasites, it will be disqualified.
18. All division champions and reserve champions and all Top 5 scholarship does will be subject to DNA and Substance testing. The Show specifically reserves the right to have ultrasound, D.N.A., tissue, blood and/or urine laboratory analysis made on any animal entered for competition. The exhibitor, including his or her parent or guardian or AST or CEA for Junior exhibitors, must be present during the collection for testing and must witness, seal and sign the sample; thus verifying the sample to be properly collected and prepared for analysis.
19. All division champions and reserve champions will be automatically eligible for the sale. However, a division champion or reserve is NOT guaranteed a top 5 Scholarship.

23. Exhibitors must be present and exhibiting their animal to receive the scholarship. All other rules of the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo Breeding Livestock Show Scholarships are applicable to contestants in this show.

2. The San Angelo Stock Show will receive \$35.00 of the original entry fee. Entries in these classes for this show will be accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the TLBAA & TLBT Official Handbooks.
3. Any member in good standing of the TLBT may show in TLBT shows through high school graduation or may be a graduating senior not exceeding 18 years of age on National Show date.
4. A photocopy of the original registration certificate must accompany entry application – no pending registration will be accepted. All animals must be registered with TLBAA and must be properly identified by brand and private herd number, and match the description of the registration certificate.
5. Texas Longhorn Breeders of Tomorrow shows are considered open shows. Cattle may be owned by youth, ranch or other breeders of Texas Longhorn cattle.
6. All animals must be at least 120 days old to be eligible to show.
7. Cattle may be subjected to mouthing by a certified veterinarian for age verification.
8. No grooming chutes are allowed.
9. NOSE LEADS with strap (not tongs) will be used on bulls 12 months and over.
10. Animals must be kept under control at all times. Should an animal become unmanageable, the show manager and/or the San Angelo Stock Show management shall have the right and responsibility to remove such animal from competition and all entry fees shall be forfeited.
11. A dress code will be enforced at these shows.
  - Western attire, long sleeve shirt with collar and cuffs. Western boots and western jeans are to be worn while in the ring. Western hats (not caps) may be worn. Violators of this rule will be disqualified upon the discretion of the show committee.

2. Trophies and prizes will be furnished.
3. Judging will be done by recognized livestock judges and breeders.
4. Each exhibitor may enter only one heifer in the futurity. Each contestant must show the animals they enter, as well as own the animal they exhibit. Heifer must be entered and shown in its respective breed at San Angelo. **Two trophy buckles will be presented: one for the high scoring contestant over 13, and one for the high scoring contestant 13 or under. 5. Four places split 20%, 15%, 10% and 5% will be paid to the top four winners in each age division from the total of entries.

6. If tie scores occur, tie will be broken by using reasons score first, then showmanship, judging and sales talk.

D. Sales talk by the exhibitors	50 points possible
8. All entries must conform to the rules and regulations of their respective breed and the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo Association. The Heifer Futurity section of the Junior Heifer Entry Form must be filled out listing the breed.
9. Showmanship will be judged as a special class and points will be awarded to each contestant. Primary considerations will be presentation of the animal and show it to best advantage. 1. All rules apply to the Junior Angus Heifer Show. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules.
2. All animals to be eligible to show must be recorded in the American Angus Association Record. Exhibitors must file with the Stock Show Office the name and herd book of each animal entered.
3. All exhibitors must have owned the heifers shown in the name continuously since November 1, 2011, and the official registration certificate must indicate that the exhibitor was the sole owner of the heifer on or before November 1, 2011 and that the registration certificate was processed by the American Angus Association on or before November 1, 2011.
4. To be eligible to show, all heifers must have been calved after September 1, 2009. Only Black Angus are allowed in this show.
5. There is no limit on the number of heifers an exhibitor may show, however, all animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name.
6. **THIS IS A NON-FIT SHOW. BLOW & SHOW ONLY!** Do not use black paint, glue or other adhesives on your heifers. Keep it simple and your work will be less and the heifers will love you for it. See the American Angus Association's statement on the use of products from aerosol cans.
7. Substitutions of heifers already entered may be made as long as the substituted heifer conforms to all rules applying to this show.
8. All exhibitors are eligible to compete for a Junior or Senior Showmanship award. Exhibitors 13 years old or younger on January 1, 2012, will be eligible to compete for Jr. Showmanship, and exhibitors 14 years old or older on January 1, 2012 will be eligible to compete for Sr. Showmanship.
9. If any classes have an excessive number of entries, they will be divided into two or more classes according to American Angus Association guidelines.
10. All exhibitors will be issued a show number for each heifer entered in the show, and no heifer will be allowed in the show ring to be judged unless the exhibitor leading the heifer is wearing the number assigned to the heifer being shown.
11. Exhibitors entering this show are eligible to enter the All Breed Junior Heifer Futurity. However, entry to the Futurity requires separate designation on the entry form, as well as, additional entry fees. Exhibitors are NOT automatically entered into the Futurity.
12. An animal that is disqualified for ANY REASON in its respective breed show will be disqualified from the Heifer Futurity, as well. Additionally, the exhibitor will be required to forfeit any premiums, ribbons and/or any other prizes won in the Futurity Show, but in no event shall it affect the order of finish of any of the other animals competing in the Futurity Show.

13. The exhibitor of the Grand Champion Angus Heifer will receive a \$500.00 incentive. The exhibitor of the Reserve Champion Angus Heifer will receive a \$250.00 incentive. Incentive recipients may enter future shows and may receive another incentive. Exhibitors must be present and exhibiting their own animal to be awarded the scholarship.

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, MO, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The Association's contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the Junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums. Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

To be eligible for association premiums, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individuals show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class. Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in the championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show.

Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

When any female is shown with a calf at side, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair); use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

For an exhibitor to be eligible at shows for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, each exhibitor is subject to Part 3, Section IX of the Association's rules entitled "Eligibility, Conformation, and Structure of Animals Presented for Exhibition." Included in this is Rule 11: "Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents on any animal exhibited." The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" text. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

DNA marker or blood type for parentage verification – Under Association Rules each animal, for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a DNA marker type or blood type test to verify ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE as covered under Association Rules. Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of DNA or blood samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs, or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate.

If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of DNA or blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herd Book and the registration certificate becomes null and void.

4. To be eligible to show, the heifers must have been calved between September 1, 2009 and August 31, 2011.
5. All exhibitors all exhibitors or their representatives are asked to remain with their heifers during check-in. All heifers MAY be frame scored at check-in and scores used by the judges at his/her discretion. Faxes and copies of registration certificates will not be accepted.

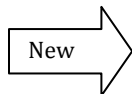

6. Each contestant must provide the following items to the superintendent **on the day of the contest** to be eligible to participate:

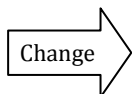
**(a)** Manuscript: One typed copy of the speech manuscript on 8½ x 11” paper, stapled in the top left hand corner. The manuscript must be the result of the student’s own effort and follow the MLA style.

**(b)** Bibliography: A complete and accurate bibliography or works cited used in writing the speech must be attached to the manuscript and also follow the MLA style.

**(c)** A statement of originality signed by the contestant, parents, and AST/CEA must be attached to each copy of the speech. This is found on the website at [www.sanangelorodeo.com](http://www.sanangelorodeo.com)

**(d)** If a contestant chooses to not follow the documentation guidelines outlined, point deductions will be taken at the discretion of the Superintendent, Show Management and Judges.

**(e)** If a contestant does not submit a copy of their speech, they will not be allowed to compete. They will be disqualified and forfeit their entry fee.



7. The use of props of any kind is prohibited. Violation will result in disqualification.
8. Each speech shall be a minimum of six (6) minutes in length and a maximum of eight (8) minutes. Time point deductions will be as follows:

**Animal Science:** Any current or future subject that deals with any aspect of the dairy, equine, poultry, sheep, goat, swine, beef or specialty animal industries.

**Plant Science:** Any current or future subject that deals with any aspect of the horticulture and/or agronomy industries including floriculture, fruit and/or vegetable production, nursery operations, turf and landscape management, crop production, or specialty crop production

**Natural Resources:** Any current or future subject that deals with topics such as soil, water, air, water quality, wildlife, forestry, aquaculture, conservation, recreation, recycling, energy environmental issues, etc.

1. **Entry fee:** Entries must be made on an official Ag Mechanics Entry form and signed by the AST/CEA overseeing the project. Exhibitors and projects must be listed on entry form at time of entry.

2. **Eligible Entries:** Entries must be the work of eligible exhibitors – limited to Texas FFA and 4-H members. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules. There is no limit to the total number of projects a 4-H club or FFA Chapter may enter. The San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo reserves the right to refuse any exhibit.

3. **Projects:** must be constructed by FFA & 4-H members. FFA projects must be constructed as a part of their agriculture mechanic instruction in agriculture science or as part of their supervised work experience program. 4-H projects must be constructed under the supervision of their County Extension Agent.

4. **Club/Chapter Entries:** Group entries must be made in the name of the FFA Chapter or 4H club. All group entries must include all the names of the exhibitors who participated in planning and construction of the project.

5. **Individual/Group:** Projects may be either individually or group constructed and owned.

6. **Exhibit Space:** Projects will be displayed in the Spur Arena by divisions and classes. Placement of projects will be at the discretion of stock show officials. Display space under shelter is not guaranteed. **Projects may be displayed at an alternate site if sufficient space is not available at the Spur Arena.**

7. **Construction Date:** A project may be exhibited only one time at the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo and must have been constructed within one calendar year of the exhibition date.

8. **Types of Projects:** Any project that does not fit into one of the stated classes will be disqualified. Projects may be subject to reclassification upon arrival. Projects **MUST** be classified in one of the following division and classes:

**9. Classes with less than four entries are subject to being combined.**

**10. Vehicles:** No trucks, non-entered tractors or trailers are allowed in the exhibition area.

**11. Projects Requiring Offloading Assistance:** Projects that need to be lifted from the topside area to be fitted with lifting eyes at balance points that accommodate 1" shackles. Projects that cannot be safely unloaded will be shown at an alternate site.

**12. Safety:** All safety procedures must be adhered to when displaying projects but not limited to:

- A. Appropriate and safe display stands provided for gates, panels and other projects needing support.
- B. Sharp edges and points (as on feeder roofs, bale movers, etc.) must be padded or covered to prevent injury.
- C. All trailers and other equipment that is operated on or transported on public roads must be equipped with safety equipment as stated in the latest DOT publication. All three-point hitch and P.T.O. operated equipment is to meet ASAE standards and specifications.

**13. Project completeness:** All projects should be complete including finish. Projects are to be clean, free of dust and debris, and in a presentable condition even though they may have been used. Any item, necessary for use of the project must be a part of it (example: hinges and latches on gates and panels, etc.). Trailers and all other

equipment are to be displayed in transport position. Ramps, extensions and operation of specific features may be demonstrated as directed by the official judges and as space allows. The project display area (including the floor under and around the project) should be neat. Floor covering will be limited to the area under the project.

14. Welds: No structural welds are to be ground without penalty. Grinding is to be limited to welds that should be ground for functional reasons and/or welds that would normally be ground for cosmetic purposes. Examples: top rails on trailers, fender body outside tops, side latches, etc. may be ground, but frames, cross-members, tongues, filler pipe, etc. are not to be ground.



**15. Any equipment to travel on public highways must meet Federal DOT Standards. Current Federal DOT inspection stickers will be honored. Anything that does not have a current DOT inspection sticker will be subject to inspection by a TXDOT inspector.**

16. Exhibitor Presentation: Exhibitors should be dressed appropriately and be with their project when it is judged. Exhibitors should be courteous and helpful to those viewing their project including the public, show officials, and judges. Exhibitors should not interfere with or shield those exhibitors next to them. Exhibitors will be allowed cleaning or preparation supplies, limited to quantities that will fit in a common 5 gallon bucket, in the exhibition area.

17. Exhibitors must be present to present projects. Absence must be approved by committee.

18. Signs: All projects are to be identified. Information should include – Exhibitor(s) Name, Club/Chapter, and Project Description. Additional signs, banners, etc. must meet the approval of the committee members and can not extend beyond the project's display space.

19. Cleaning of projects will be limited to the use of spray bottles and towels.

20. Loss or Damage: Ever precaution will be taken to protect the projects entered; however, neither the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo nor the officials of this contest will be responsible for fire, theft, vandalism or destruction to the projects.

21. Judging System for first five divisions:

- a. Workmanship.....25 points
  - b. Students' Knowledge of project.....25 points
  - c. Design and Materials.....10 points
  - d. Practicality.....10 points
  - e. Degree of Difficulty.....10 points
  - f. Finish.....10 points
  - g. Plans, Bill of Materials, Photographs  
and if applicable, DOT standard for the project.....10 points
- TOTAL.....100 POINTS**

**Plans, Bill of Materials, Photographs:** Exhibitors should provide an original, exhibitor drawn plan, photographs showing stages of production, and a complete bill of materials.

**Student Knowledge:** Exhibitor(s) may be asked questions concerning, but not limited to project construction, design, use, operation, etc. Exhibitors may also be asked to demonstrate all or parts of the project's operation.

22. Judging System for Tractor Division:

- a. Mechanical.....50 points
  - b. Aesthetics.....20 points
  - c. Originality.....10 points
  - d. Safety Equipment.....10 points
  - e. Documentation.....10 points

**Mechanical** will include the restoration of engine, transmission, final drive, fuel system, cooling system, cranking or starting system, charging system, hydraulic system, steering system, etc.

**Aesthetics** will include the overall appearance of the tractor. This includes workmanship and finish. Items to be considered include, but are not limited to: metal preparation, completeness of sheet metal, paint and finish, detail and completeness of components such as wheels, tires, steering wheels, seats, decals, instrument panels, wiring harness, etc.

**Originality** will include paint color, fasteners, electrical systems, fuel systems, exhaust systems, mechanical systems, original unaltered serial places, etc.

**Safety** equipment will include all equipment that was original to the tractor. It also includes the provision of drip pans containing floor absorbent to collect any liquids that may drip from the tractor during display. Fuel shutoff valves under all fuel tanks must be functional and tractors are to be exhibited with the valves closed. An ABC fire extinguisher with a minimum 2.5 pounds capacity must be provided with each tractor. Extra fuel may not be stored in the arena. Tractor engines are to be started and run only at the request of judges or show officials.

**Documentation** must be typed or computer generated and is to include a one page description of the overall restoration project, and expense report identifying all costs of restoration, photos showing before, during and after restoration that shows safe working environment, and a complete description of all mechanical work performed. All documentation is to be displayed in a three-binder, divided, and sequenced with a table of contents and page numbers. The National FFA Tractor Restoration Competition format and forms may be used.

23. **Showmanship:** Awards will be presented to schools/clubs and individuals selected as having presented the best public image by an independent judge. Judging will begin at unloading and continue until awards are given. There will be two categories: group and individual. Champion and Reserve Champion will be given in each category.

Considerations will be, but not limited to:

- a. Appropriate display and presentation of project
- b. Appropriate display of project plans, bill of materials and photographs
- c. Housekeeping around project
- d. Appropriate dress
- e. Conduct, attitude, and participation of students

24. **Sweepstakes:** Awarded to the FFA Chapter or 4-H Club that accumulates the most points based on number of entries with each placing and division Champions and Reserve Champions.

25. **Awards:** Blue, Red & White ribbons will be given for quality, Ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> will also be given for each class from the BLUE RIBBON projects ONLY. 1<sup>st</sup> place winners will receive \$75.00; 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$50.00; 3<sup>rd</sup> \$25.00.

1. All rules apply to the Open Breeding Sheep Show. Please refer to the General Rules and Junior Show Rules.
2. Each livestock entry card must contain full name, address, and social security number of exhibitor, the name of breed, and the number of head entered. It will not be necessary to give the name of the animal, registry number or name of sire and dam until the certificates of registry are presented to the superintendents. **Health papers are required; please check the Animal Health Regulations for complete details.**
3. All sheep will be judged according to the classification on Breed Association score card (breed standards).
4. All breeding sheep must be registered in the flock books of their respective breeds, and bear such identification as that breed association requires, before entering the ring. Sheep not carrying ear tags or tattoo at time of showing will be barred from competition.
5. The breeder of an animal is the owner of the dam at the time of service. If an individual showing sheep in the registered classes is such a breeder, the lamb must be registered in his/her name by opening day of the show.
6. If an individual is showing a sheep in the registered classes that is a gift from some breeder, or if the sheep has been purchased from some breeder, the transfer certificate must be dated on Association records on or before January 15 of the year preceding this show.
7. In the Rambouillet, Delaine, Columbia and Southdown shows, classes are provided for lambs, two-tooth sheep and four to six-tooth sheep. Sheep in the lamb classes must retain all lamb teeth and be at least 6 months of age. Sheep which have dropped one or more milk teeth, or show one or both teeth of the first permanent pair of incisors are eligible only on the two-tooth classes. Sheep showing the first two pair or three pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show in the four to six-tooth classes only. In order to be able to move a ewe lamb or buck lamb up, you must fill the class first.
8. In the Dorper show, classes are provided for lambs, yearling, and aged sheep. Dorpers will be classed by the birth date on the registration papers. If the birth date falls on the date of the show, sheep will be moved to the next older age class.
9. Each exhibitor may show three and place two entries in each single class but may show only one entry in a group class.
10. Any animal exhibited in a group class (i.e. a pair of Ram Lambs) must be entered in its respective class (i.e. Ram Lamb class) in the show, as well.
11. Pen assignments will be made by pen stewards at time of arrival. One pen will be assigned per two entries.
12. UNLOADING IN FRONT OF THE BARN IS PROHIBITED!

13. In the Delaine division, lambs and two-tooth sheep may be shown in full fleece. Four to six-tooth sheep must have been shorn with a machine, using Texas combs, over the entire body since March 15<sup>th</sup> of the year preceding the show.
14. All Rambouillet and Columbia sheep must be shorn on or after October 20<sup>th</sup> of the year preceding the show.
15. All Southdown and Dorper sheep must be slick shorn within one week prior to show. Foretops and boots may be left on Southdown sheep. Boots may be left on the Dorper sheep and all Dorper sheep must have docked tails.
16. There will be two Dorper sheep shows: 1) Dorper (white with black heads) and 2) White Dorper (all white), must indicate which show on entry forms. **All dorpers must be born on or after 1/1/2009.**
17. American purebred Dorper ewes must be at least 7/8 blood and will show with full blood South African ewes. American purebred Dorper rams must be at least 15/16 blood and will show with full blood South African rams.
18. The Open Dorper Sheep Show will be judged by an approved judge. The American Dorper sheep Breeders Society will furnish a list of approved judges to the show.

1. All rules apply to the Open Boer Goat Show. Please refer to the General Rules.
2. Each livestock entry card must contain full name, address, and social security number of exhibitor, the name of breed, and the number of head entered. It will not be necessary to give the name of the animal, registry number or name of sire and dam until the certificates of registry are presented to the superintendents. **Health papers are required; please check the Animal Health Regulations for complete details.**
2. It is not necessary to identify the animals at time of entry, but the registration certificates are required at check-in. Health papers are required; please check Animal Health Regulations for complete details.
3. All goats must be registered in the respective flock books of the recognized Boer Goat Associations and bear such identification as that breed association requires at check-in. Goats not carrying such identification at validation shall be disqualified from competition.
4. The breeder of a goat is the owner of the dam at the time of service. Such a breeder must have his/her entries in his/her name and produce same registration certificates at check-in.
5. If an individual is showing a goat in the registered classes that is a gift from a breeder or if the goat has been purchased from some breeder the goat must be transferred and/or registered in the exhibitors name with the respective flock book of the respective recognized Boer Goat Associations on or before January 15 of the year preceding the show.
6. Partnerships will be accepted only if all partners are listed on the registration certificate and all partners are eligible. Partnership entries must remain as partnerships. Partners cannot show in individual classes.
7. Percentage females, full blood males and full blood female goats will be classed by birth date on certificate of registration. If birth date falls on date of show, goat will be moved to next upper age class.
8. Exhibitors are not allowed to enter more than three head per class in any division, but may only receive premiums on two per class.
9. The judge making awards must have the clerk record ear number, ear tag or tattoo of all animals awarded prizes.
10. Heelers will be allowed in the class.
11. The fitting of hair of all animals will be left up to the discretion of the exhibitor: with the exception of artificial color and the use of drugs and/or chemicals that are not approved by the FDA or USDA. If an exhibitor's animal is found to have been dyed, the said animal will be disqualified from the show and the said exhibitor will be barred from future shows. Goats may be clipped after arrival.
12. Goats may be washed after arrival. Facilities are available for washing goats in the swine area.
13. Pen assignments will be made by pen stewards at time of arrival. One pen will be assigned per two entries.

14. All goats must be removed from the barn after the show unless retained for exhibit.
15. Exhibitors must kid proof their own pens. Materials will not be provided for this.

6. Judges shall not award a prize to an unworthy exhibit. The judges shall determine the method and points for scoring the fleeces.
7. **TWELVE MONTHS WOOL-** Fleeces from aged ewes shall not have over 13 months of growth. Fleece from yearling ewes shall not have over 16 months growth. Removal of bellies in fleeces is optional. Fleeces must be tied with paper twine.
8. **MOHAIR-** Fleeces shall not be over 8 inches in length. Micron Requirements:  
Kid Class Fleeces- 30 Microns or Finer  
Yearling Class Fleeces- 30-34 Microns  
Adult Class Fleeces- 35 Microns or Coarser  
All mohair fleeces must be spring shorn in the spring of 2011 or 2012. **FLEECES MUST BE ENTERED IN CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS.**
9. All wool and mohair fleeces must be produced by one animal and must be identified as fleeces of one animal. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
10. Exhibitors shall be disqualified for any of the following reasons: fleeces show an excessive amount of burrs, vegetable matter, discoloration by moisture, weakness of breaks, lack of due care in preparation and fleeces tied with anything other than paper twine.
11. It shall be the exhibitor's responsibility to enter the fleece in the proper class. Fleeces not meeting requirements for length and grade in the classes entered shall be disqualified from the show.

The Champion winner will receive \$500 and the Reserve Champion winner will receive \$250. Incentives will be paid in full to the exhibitor and will be mailed with other premiums. Checks will go out approximately Mid-April. These champions will be named during the show on Sunday.

**Pack Classes (Open and Youth):** Animals must be 5 months of age or older. All exhibitors must provide their own saddle and panniers, or training pack as specified by the current ALSA Handbook.

**Adult Showmanship:** Adult Showmanship class is open to exhibitors aged 10 and older. (If a youth turns 19 during their final youth show season, they have the option to continue to show in the Senior Showmanship class, but if the youth shows in an Adult Showmanship class they no longer are eligible to complete in youth showmanship class.)

### **Wool Divisions:**

**Suri Wool:** Suri llamas have a natural balanced, athletic type, which may appear narrower than llamas of other fiber types when viewed from the front or rear. The fleece of a Suri Llama should have a natural luster and hang and drape over the llamas body, usually forming a natural part of the spine. The fibers are grouped into very distinct and well-defined locks with many

individual separate locks of fiber formed at the skin and carrying out to the ends of each lock. The fleece should be lustrous, the locks independent and consistent in size, and the degree of wave or spiral content throughout the neck and body. The fiber is also characterized by absence of crimp and minimal loft.

**Light Wool:** Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs.

**Medium Wool:** Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

**Heavy Wool:** Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool. (i.e., leg wool at least to knee and hock).

**Produce of Dam and Get of Sire Classes:** These classes are entered under the name of the Dam and Sire. Registration certificates of the Dam or Sire must be sent with the entry. If Dam &/or Sire is not present at the show, an ALSA fee of \$5.00 must be sent with the entry. There may be more than one entry for a Dam or Sire but only the top placing will earn points.

-Produce of Dam consists of two offspring by the same dam, each shown in appropriate halter classes.

-Get of Sire consists of three offspring by the same sire by a least two dams, each shown in appropriate class.

-Offspring must be designated to show management before these classes or held.

**Age Divisions for Animals Entries:** Age determined by the age of the llama on the day they enter the ring in halter.

Juvenile.....5 through 12 months

Two Year Olds.....25 through 36 months

Yearling.....13 through 24 months

Adult.....37 months and older

Show management reserves the right to combine wool divisions if lack of enough entries warrants the decision.

-Ribbons will be awarded in all classes for places 1-5. Banners will be awarded for all Grand and Reserve Champions

-Additional cash premiums are offered by the San Angelo Stock Show Association, the South Central Llama Association, Llama Breeders and Friends of the San Angelo Llama Show.
